

RUN4ALL NEATH

RULES AND CONSTITUTION

1. The name of the Club is Run4All Neath.
2. The Headquarters of the Club is Cwrt Herbert Sports Centre, Neath.
3. The object of the Club is to promote Amateur Athletics in the local community.
4. The Management of the Club is vested in a Committee consisting of a Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and at least 3 other members all to be elected annually. Anyone applying for a place on the Committee must be a first claim member.
5. Membership of the Club is confined to amateurs who are eligible to compete under BAF laws. A candidate for membership should apply in writing on a form provided for the purpose and approved by the Committee.
6. A member intending to withdraw from the Club shall give notice in writing to the Secretary and his/her membership terminated on the date of that notice unless he/she is financially indebted to the Club, in which case the Committee may withhold acceptance of the resignation until he/she has discharged his/her liability.
7. The annual subscription to the Club is £20.00 payable on election and subsequently on the 1st of April each year subject to review annually.
 - a. The Committee shall have the power to expel any member whose subscription is 6 months in arrears provided a months notice in writing shall have been sent to such member by registered letter addressed to his/her last known address, informing him/her of the proposed action of the Committee.
 - b. No member whose subscription is in arrears is eligible to take part in any competition by the Club.
8.
 - a. The Club colours shall be yellow/black.
 - b. Club colours must be worn by all competitors representing the Club at every competitive meeting.
9. The Annual General Meeting shall be held in the month of March in every year to receive the Committee's report and financial statement, elect the Committee and deal with any other matters specific on the Agenda. Motions to be discussed must be submitted in writing to the Club Secretary prior to the meeting. The Chairperson shall have the casting vote.
10. The Committee, by a two thirds majority at a meeting may propose amendment to the Constitution. The changes may be only made at the AGM or Extraordinary General Meeting called for that purpose. If the motion is passed by a two thirds majority the amendment to the Constitution will be adopted.
11. The Committee may expel from the Club any member who they may deem guilty of conduct detrimental to the interest of the Club or to amateur athletics generally,

however, any such member on giving notice within 7 days of receipt of a notice of expulsion may claim the right of appeal to an extraordinary general meeting which must be held within 14 days of receipt of the appeal. A majority of those voting at such a meeting is necessary to reinstate membership.

12. The Committee shall decide any question as to the interpretation of the Rules and deal with any matter not provided for within.
